1. Introduction

- 1.1 The Primary Care Commissioning Committee (PCCC) and its predecessor the Joint Primary Care Commissioning Committee has previously considered papers that have described the intention to produce a Primary Care Commissioning Strategy for Dorset.
- 1.2 The Primary Care Commissioning Strategy and Plan is designed to be implemented over a 5 year period aligning to; the GP Five Year Forward View, Our Dorset Sustainability and Transformation Plan and the Dorset Integrated Community Services Strategy.
- 1.3 In support of plans to deliver our Strategy the CCG submitted a GP Forward View Delivery Plan for 2017-19 to NHS England on 23 December. The plan outlines the engagement of Member practices in considering key areas of the GP Forward View and covers the key requirements set out in NHS England Operational Planning Guidance for CCGs.
- 1.4 Further detailed Strategy Implementation Plans will be developed with localities as part of transformation.

2. Process

- 2.1 This Strategy has been produced following a period of engagement between June and October 2016 with GP Members and their teams, Practice Managers, CCG clinicians and managers, patients and the LMC. This engagement period built on previous engagement work to inform the Integrated Community Services models of which General Practice forms a key part. It has been considered by the Primary Care Operational Group (PCOG) and the Primary Care Reference Group (PCRG). It has also been shared at various stages of development with the GP Membership and Governing Body.
- 2.2 Following feedback from this Committee on the framework, initial content and direction of travel, a Task and Finish Group (TFG) was established to review the outputs of the engagement phase over the summer, advising and taking direction from the Primary Care Operational Group and Primary Care Reference Group. This TFG had representation from all key departments within the CCG, in order for the Strategy to be informed by the relevant expertise, as well as be owned by the whole organisation. This group also had representation from the LMC and Public Health. A Strategy sub-group made up of several members of the Primary Care Team have produced the final document.

3. Document

- 3.1 The key messages in the document are highlighted in the Executive Summary and describe a vision where General Practice continues to be the foundation of the health system, maintaining its position as the leaders of primary care, retaining its identity and registered list. For it to build on its strengths and past successes by working in larger groups to achieve sustainability, as part of wider primary and community teams across a range of sites, delivering care with improved quality, outcomes and access, while recognising the importance of continuity of care and building long-term relationships with patients.
- 3.2 The CCG is committed to working with localities to co-develop the local blueprints that the document starts to describe.

4. Conclusion

- 4.1 The Strategy has been produced following a period of engagement with member practices and key stakeholders.

5. Recommendation

- 5.1 The Governing Body is asked to approve the Dorset Primary Care Commissioning Strategy and Plan.
