### **CCG Assurance**

- 2.3 NHS England, as part of the Improvement and Assessment Framework, published on 17 January 2019 the 2017/18 ratings for the following clinical areas:
  - Mental health – good
  - Dementia – requires improvement
  - Learning disability – requires improvement
  - Diabetes – inadequate
- 2.4 For the diabetes clinical area an action plan was put in place and some of the actions that have been taken include:-

- Dorset Integrated Care System has been chosen as a pilot site for Population Health Management. Diabetes has been chosen as a priority in the East Bournemouth locality and will develop a better understanding of population health needs and new commissioning models;
- MyMHealth diabetes self-management proof of concept pilot is being evaluated by University of Southampton;
- New work programme for transition to adult services developed and will be facilitated as part of a Diabetes UK Change Lab;
- Continuous glucose monitoring protocol for adults in place, as is a protocol for Freestyle Libre for adults and children. We await further clarification of guidelines for Libre access expansion from April 2019;
- Living Well Taking Control was commissioned to provide the Diabetes Prevention Programme in Dorset. It is now live across Dorset with referrals and initial assessments exceeding expectations;
- 100% of practices are participating in the National Diabetes Audit;
- Dorset WISDOM multi-disciplinary teams were rolled out and now cover all localities. WISDOM focuses on improving the management of blood pressure, cholesterol and HbA1c in general practice. With GP practice sign up to WISDOM standing at 80 out of 86 in January 2019;
- developing a system to ensure attendance is reported back to GPs and recorded in patient notes, as the national data collection is from general practice, not the education providers. This will result in improved reporting and therefore performance data next year;
- Wessex Diabetic Foot Care Peer Review has taken place.
