FUNCTIONAL ELECTRONIC STIMULATION (FES) CRITERIA BASED ACCESS PROTOCOL

1. INTRODUCTION AND SCOPE

- 1.1 NHS Dorset CCG referred people historically to Odstock Medical Services for Functional Electronic Stimulation (FES). These services are only provided to patients that had ongoing treatment prior to the development of a commissioning position.
- 1.2 The Pan-Dorset Technologies Forum reviewed the evidence in 2012 and NHS Dorset CCG agreed that no new patients would be referred for treatment by FES.
- 1.3 Public Health undertook a literature review in September 2015 on the effectiveness and cost-effectiveness of FES for patients with drop foot. Following evaluation of the literature review, NHS Dorset CCG made no amendments to the access criteria for treatment by FES.

2. DEFINITIONS

- 2.1 Any definitions related to this Criteria Based Access Protocol are included as a Glossary at Appendix A.

3. ACCESS CRITERIA

- 3.1 For patients receiving treatment prior to 2012, the following access criteria applied:
 - Documented history of tripping, falling, gait problems;
 - Full range of ankle dorsal flexion/good calf tone/absence of severe spasticity and lower limb oedema.
- 3.2 Patients will only be considered for ongoing funding by NHS Dorset CCG for these patients, CCG if they continue to meet both these criteria.

4. EXCLUSIONS

- 4.1 No new patients will be referred for FES treatment.
- 4.2 It should be noted that the following are specifically excluded:
 - Treatment using FES of anything other than the lower limbs;
 - Implanted FES (also known as SIMUSTEP).

5. CASES FOR INDIVIDUAL CONSIDERATION

- 5.1 Should a patient not meet the criteria detailed within this protocol, the Policy for Individual Patient Treatments (which is available on the NHS Dorset Clinical

Commissioning Group website or upon request), recognises that there will be occasions when patients who are not considered for funding may have good clinical reasons for being treated as exceptions. In such cases the requesting clinician must provide further information to support the case for being considered as an exception.

- 5.2 The fact that treatment is likely to be effective for a patient is not, in itself a basis for exceptional circumstances. In order for funding to be agreed there must be some unusual or unique clinical factor in respect of the patient that suggests that they are:
- significantly different to the general population of patients with the particular condition; and
 - they are likely to gain significantly more benefits from the intervention than might be expected for the average patient with the condition

6. CONSULTATION

- 6.1 A literature review was undertaken in September 2015 to ascertain whether there were any new implications on the FES protocol that had been in place from September 2012.
- 6.2 Prior to approval from Dorset CCG's Clinical Commissioning Committee this Protocol was reviewed by the Long Term Conditions and Frail Elderly CDG.
- 6.3 An Equality Impact Assessment for this Criteria Based Access Protocol is available on request.

7. RECOMMENDATION AND APPROVAL PROCESS

- 7.1 As documented in NHS Dorset CCG's 'Procedure for the management and development of procedural documents', Criteria Based Access Protocols must be formally recommended by the Clinical Delivery Group responsible for the protocol, prior to formal approval by the Clinical Commissioning Committee.

8. COMMUNICATION/DISSEMINATION

- 8.1 Following approval of Criteria Based Access Protocols at Clinical Commissioning Committee each Protocol will be uploaded to the CCG's Intranet, Internet and added to the next GP Bulletin.

9. IMPLEMENTATION

- 9.1 Following review of this Criteria Based Access Protocol it was agreed there were no new aspects to be included in this version and therefore no requirement for an implementation plan.

10. DOCUMENT REVIEW FREQUENCY AND VERSION CONTROL

- 10.1 This Criteria Based Access Protocol requires a review every three years, or in the event of any changes to national guidance or when new guidance is issued.
